The Cycle of Judges

- 1. Peace in the land
- 2. Israel does what is evil in the sight of the LORD
- 3. They chase after idols and join with other nations
- 4. God gives them into the hand of those nations
- 5. Israel repents
- 6. Israel cries out to God for help
- 7. God sends a deliverer
- 8. Repeat ad nauseum

Judges 6:11-13

- 2. "And where are all of his wonderful deeds that our fathers recounted to us?"
- 3. "But now the LORD has forsaken us and given us into the hand of Midian."
